1982 to 1989

The Institution of Engineers, Australia; Executive Officer, Sydney Division. During this period the Division operated with substantial surpluses and excellent service was rendered to members, all at a fairly low cost. Arrangements for the President of the Institution or the Chairman of the Division with myself, to meet the Governor, Parliamentarians, Ministers or Heads of Governments were made by me. I was responsible for organising the Bicentennial Engineering Conference in Sydney in February 1988 which was attended by 900 delegates from around Australia and overseas.
